#### **Crazy collections!**

The first bananas came from Asia and were probably discovered by the soldiers of Alexander the Great. The soldiers sold the bananas to Arab traders in Africa, and later, bananas arrived in Brazil and Central America. Half of the world's banana crop is produced in Africa. The leading exporting countries, however, are in Central America and northern South America. Bananas are a very popular fruit worldwide.

Becky Martz also loved bananas. In 1991, she first noticed banana stickers when she put two bananas in the fruit bowl together. She noticed that the "Dole" labels actually weren't quite the same; one said Guatemala and the other said Honduras. Later that year, she noticed an attractive "Chiquita" sticker and decided that she wanted to collect all the different banana stickers.

Today Becky has more than 7,000 different stickers. Becky isn't alone. There are others like her in the world, and they even have their own festival where collectors from all over the world meet to trade\* their stickers. They also have banana collection websites with recipes and other information about bananas.

Carsten Gutzeit of Germany has collected more than 1,000 tubes of toothpaste\* from 60 different countries. Collecting things was common in Gutzeit's family.

His grandfather had a big collection of stamp albums. He began to give Carsten stamps to start a collection, too, but Carsten sold the collection when his grandfather died. He started collecting plastic bags instead, when he was 15. He continued for five years. Then one day in 1989, while he was traveling around Israel, he saw an interesting tube of toothpaste. He bought it and when he finished it, he decided to keep the empty tube to remind him of his holiday. He did the same in France on his next holiday, and then in Denmark. Back home, he stuck the empty tubes on his bathroom wall and decided they looked good. And his collection then became serious. When his collection grew too big for the bathroom wall, he moved it to the cellar. Carsten's grandfather would have been proud!
